**Creating a life that works in the flexible job age?** Wednesday 14 July 2010, 5.45pm for a 6.00pm start, Bradley Forum, [UniSA City West campus](#), Hawke Building level 5, 50-55 North Terrace, Adelaide. To be delivered by Professor Ellen Ernst Kossek - University Distinguished Professor, Michigan State University's Graduate School of Human Resources and Labor Relations. In the age of 24/7 work, mobile phones, smart phones, texting and growing family obligations, we increasingly struggle with how to manage work-life relationships. Many of us need help in thinking about what is currently working well in the area of work-life, to be empowered to be in charge of own lives. In this talk Professor Kossek will focus on 'flexstyles' – the different ways that people psychologically manage work-life boundaries.
