VINNIES' CEO SLEEPOUT GOES NATIONAL

Following its huge success in Sydney last year, the Vinnies CEO Sleepout goes national on **Thursday June 17 2010**, when hundreds of CEOs and business leaders will sleep out across Australia. The event, which is launched today by the Federal Minister for Housing, Tanya Plibersek, as part of Vinnies Winter Appeal, aims to raise awareness about homelessness, and to raise funds for Vinnies homeless services across Australia. Last year in Sydney alone, more than 200 business leaders slept out to raise \$620,000, which wildly exceeded expectations.

This year the event will be held in Sydney (Luna Park), Canberra (National Museum of Australia), Melbourne (Etihad Stadium), Adelaide (Adelaide Zoo), Perth (WACA), Darwin (The Gardens Oval) and Brisbane (Suncorp Piazza, Southbank) with a target of more than \$1 million. HAWKE CENTRE FREE PUBLIC LECTURE

Celebrated author, [Nicolas Rothwell](#) and Independent Member of the NT Legislative Assembly, [Alison Anderson](#) will take up this topic in a public session chaired by Professor Peter Buckskin, Head of the David Unaipon College of Indigenous Education and Research at UniSA. **Alison Anderson** will review the experience of recent policy initiatives on the ground, as felt by language-speaking members of desert indigenous societies, and noting that almost all comment on the Intervention and its effects has been by outsiders without capacity to know the true responses of the target social group. She will also explain what she regards as the fiasco of the present SIHIP program in the NT, and the bars to success in indigenous education. She considers that these issues relate strongly to the condition of the APY lands, which she knows well.

Nicolas Rothwell will provide a separate account of the assumptions underlying policy-making and the effects of the paradigm in place today on the ground. The aim is to provide a reality check and to suggest that we are still in an era of profound colonial administration, and that power relations as much as passive welfare constitute the bar to progress.
